Dairy Cow Unified Body Characters

General Appearance

- 1. Stature- Height including moderate length in the leg bones with a long bone pattern throughout the body structure.
- 2. Front End- Adequate constitution with strength & dairy refinement.
- 3. Shoulder blades & elbow- Set firmly & smoothly against the chest wall & withers to form a smooth union with the neck & body.
- 4. Chest- Deep & full with ample width between front legs.
- 5. Back- straight & strong, Loin board, strong, & nearly level & rump long, wide & nearly level with pin bones slightly lowered than hip bones.
- 6. Thurls- High & Wide apart
- 7. Tail Head- Set nearly level with top line & with tail head & tail free from coarseness.
- 8. Legs & feet- Bone flat & strong.
- 9. Front Legs- Straight, Wide apart & squarely placed.
- 10. Hind Legs- Nearly perpendicular from hock to pastern from a side view and straight from a rear view.
- 11. Hocks- Cleanly molded & free from coarseness & puffiness.
- 12. Pasterns- Short & Strong with some flexibility.
- 13. Feet- Short & well rounded with deep heel & level sole.

Healthy Animal Characters

- 1. Moist muzzle
- 2. Shining skin.
- 3. Bright Eyes.
- 4. Active body movements.
- 5. Proper feeding and drinking water.
- 6. Proper rumination.
- 7. Proper consistency in dung quality, i.e. No watery portion, etc.

Milch Animal Characters

- 1. Wedge shape body.
- 2. Big udder size.
- 3. More space between hind limbs.
- 4. Proper attachment of Udder to the body.
- 5. Teat should be squarely placed.
- 6. All teats must be functioning properly.
- 7. Big prominent zig zag vein.
- 8. Front & hind ridges broad.
- 9. Udder maximum attached to front side.

Uddder Characters

Strongly attached, well balanced with adequate capacity, possessing quality indicating heavy milk production for a longer period of usefulness.

- 1. Fore Udder Strongly & smoothly attached, moderate length & uniform width from front to rear.
- 2. Rear Udder Strongly attached high & wide with uniform width from top to bottom & slightly rounded to udder floor.
- 3. Udder Support Udder carried snugly above the hocks showing a strong suspensory ligament with clearly defined halving.
- 4. Teats- Uniform size of medium length & diameter, cylindrical, squarely placed under each quarter, plumb, & well spaced from side & rear view.
- 5. Balance symmetry & Quality Symmetrical with moderate length, width, & depth, no quartering on sides & level floor as viewed from side.
